# Thought for the Month

---

## Coming to My Senses

What would you say is your favourite food? I imagine not many of us would say lettuce.

On the recent mindfulness course that I attended in Dorset, the community didn't say grace before we started a meal. Instead we were invited to pause and reflect mid-meal. On the first day, to build on the session that we had just done, we were asked to be silent for a couple of minutes and to eat our food mindfully, ie slowly, savouring the smell, the texture and the taste.

At that stage of the meal all I had on my plate was a bit of lettuce. So I dutifully picked a bit up with my fork and proceeded to practise some mindfulness on it. Now, I don't know if I just happened to be lucky but as I slowly bit into that piece of pale green, water-filled vegetation, I was blown away by the



flavour that hit my taste buds. It really did taste very good. In the end I spent far more than two minutes, thinking and enjoying that lettuce leaf – something that normally would disappear down my gullet as quickly as possible while my fork searched out something more exciting.



Taking the time to appreciate my food more, rather than eating as quickly as I can, was just one of the lessons I learnt from my four days away.

I guess that Christmas can create a bit of a paradox for us. We fill our homes and shops, and even our streets, with tantalizing sights and smells and sounds and tastes to excite our senses. But in so doing, we risk being so busy, or perhaps even stressed, that we fail to take in all that the festive environment we've created promises to offer us.

Taking time to allow our eyes to take in the colours and patterns of the Christmas lights or our mouths to experience the textures and flavours of a particular dish might slow us down and stop us

doing other things. But it does allow us to really enjoy more of the beauty and creativity that we surround ourselves with. As is often said, less is more.

And while we take time, savouring so much, perhaps we can pause in all the business to focus on Emmanuel – God with us, present in the here and now of every moment. As the Psalm says, "Taste and see that the LORD is good" (Psalm 34:8).

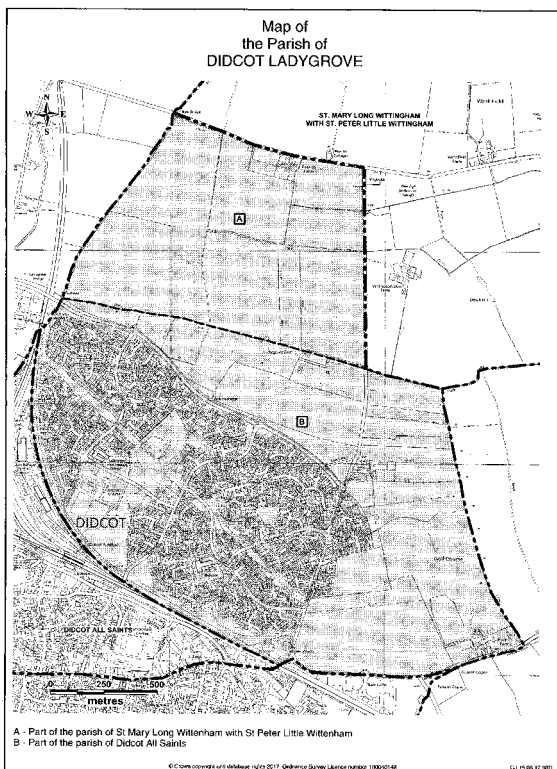

## ***Bungokho Rural Development Centre (BRDC)***

- » **Children’s education:** The nursery and primary schools have a combined number of over 150 children. The nursery section is doing very well unlike the primary which is still struggling with low numbers.
  
- » **Vocational training:**  
This year we had a lower number enrolled in the vocational school. Previously the parishes served as our major catchment area. Last year we did not have the opportunity of hosting the clergy chapter which normally serves as our sensitisation and awareness forum.  
However, we were boosted by the skills students from the diocesan youth department and other NGOs such as Compassion, ACET and Mbale diocese. There were many students sponsored on short intensive courses.  
Many students still struggle with paying school fees. This year we were only able to identify 5 students who were completely unable to pay tuition fees. These are the ones we would like to seek to support with Bursaries. (These are now being supported by The Friends of BRDC.)  
10 days ago we hosted a total of over 50 students for the external examination, (DIT and UBTEB). This week we started the end of year internal exams.

- » **Tree Planting:** This project has taken a lot of Davis's time over the last four months. This follows the discovery of high level conspiracy, fraud and deceit within the host Mbale CAP. They were responsible for distribution of the funds and the central accounts. As a result, we had numerous strategic meetings leading to the relocation of the offices, a change of brand name and the recruitment of new office bearers. (Bob Arnold now has a role in this as he has just been appointed as a director of the new management structure.)
  
- » **Community training:**  
 The community based training is finally on course after a funding gap. (Friends of Bungokho helped to fund this project during this funding gap.)  
 There are currently 105 women groups and 7 cluster groups in the new project area. The programme is run by three staff, Jimmy, Beatrice and Immaculate.  
 The skills training for the youth is underway with 41 youths training in hair dressing, carpentry, poultry vaccination and tailoring.  
 In addition we had a new concept of child sponsorship where the children are seen as a point of contact in order to reach out to the community. This has proved very successful.
  
- » **Demonstration Farm:**  
 Over the last two years we have had very poor rains and this has adversely affected our farming activities. Fortunately this second half of 2017 has seen a lot of rain. Our paddy fields are looking great and we are almost starting to lament over the excess down pour. We expect a good yield. The vegetable garden has also done very well being able to provide green veg for student lunches throughout the year.
  
- » **Recruitment 2018:**  
 In the months of November/December/January we plan to have a massive recruitment drive in order to attract more students. School leavers are being invited to open days when they can come and see what the Centre can offer in the form of skills training.

## Prayer Requests from the Centre

Please pray that under Davis's leadership the Centre may continue to provide quality training in an establishment where Christ is at the centre of all that is done. Prayer and an assembly starts the day for all the students and staff. A Christian Union is very active within the trade school. Jimmy and his team always start their meetings with Prayer, many of the members are Muslims. They are happy to join in this time of sharing that is so central to the staff and the Centre.

Davis and Mary's son Emmanuel (aged 16) continues to improve health wise following a kidney transplant in June 2015, is now back at school and doing well. He does have to see the consultant every few months. The reports are very encouraging in that the medication is keeping him very stable. This is not cheap. However with gifts and regular donations there has, wonderfully, always been enough money in the fund. Davis has said this week that they, as a family, are planning to have Christmas at their home at the Centre. The first time Emmanuel has been back for over 3 years. He is very very excited at the prospect. Please pray that he is able to travel with his family, that his health remains stable and that he remains free from malaria as the family celebrate Christmas together.

## **Didcot Emergency Foodbank**

Firstly, a big thank you to the children at the following schools and congregations of local churches who donated items so generously from their Harvest Festivals last month:

I suspect that there are others that have slipped through during the very busy sessions we have seen - I sincerely hope I haven't missed out anyone, and my apologies if that is so. Thank you too to the volunteers who have helped with all the checking and storing.



Until the beginning of October we were scraping the proverbial barrel, but thanks to your fantastic help we have good stocks to take us through the winter. Of course, within this some categories aren't so high, and **we will always welcome tinned meat, fish and vegetables and pasta, UHT milk and fruit juice.** We do also thank those who contribute regularly, month in month out.

So what has been happening in the last few months? As you may have heard or read in the media we have continued to see an increase in clients: food for 1150 in 2015, 1546 in 2016, and we passed that figure by the end of September. It looks like our total by the end of the year will be 1900-2000.

What is driving this? Whilst we respect people's privacy and don't require them to tell us why they are there, listening to what they tell us and looking at the agencies that refer them to us, the main reasons are benefit problems, illness, low incomes, addiction, family breakdown and mental health issues, not necessarily in that order.

Having said that, the figures for September and October are lower than during the same time last year; can we hope that a corner has been turned? It may be a little too early to say yet, as Universal Credit has just been rolled out here; where it has been operating for several months the Trussell Trust says that there has been a 30% increase in clients - we'll see.

Thank you again for your help, however large or small.
